You may want to think about holding your Open House in a month other than October so there is no competition in coordinating all of the outside agencies.

RECOGNITION

The MSFA believes it is important to recognize company members. Each year at the convention, members are recognized for the following reasons.

EMS Top Responder This Recognition is presented to the EMS Responder who takes the most calls "out the door".

Fire Top Responder This Recognition is presented to the Fire Responder who takes the most calls "out the door".

Rescue Top Responder This Recognition is presented to the Rescue Responder who takes the most calls "out the door".

Active Military Service This Recognition is presented to members of the Volunteer Fire, EMS, Rescue Services that have been called to Active Duty as a member of a United States Military Services.

Three or more Generations in the Fire Service This Recognition is presented to the members of families that have at least three generations. i.e. father, son, grandson...father, daughter, grandson, etc.

Over 90 Years of age and still active in

the fire company. This Recognition is presented to the members of your company that are at least 90 years old and are still actively involved in some activity at your fire station. The activity is not expected to be running calls.
